PROPOSED NOVEMBER 2016 \$90 MILLION BOND REFERENDUM

Construction of a new Northern High School \$51,875,000

A new modern multi-story facility will replace the current facility on the same site. This will be a multi-year, multiphase project.

Renovation of Eno Valley Elementary School \$7,320,194

This facility will be completely renovated, eliminating exterior corridors and improving security and access control.

System-wide security and safety measures \$4,376,250

Based on site-specific needs, safety measures such as secure doorways, access systems and cameras will be installed and upgraded to protect staff and students in 26 elementary schools, eight middle schools, 10 high schools and Central Services.

Roofing upgrades \$11,412,500

Existing roofing systems will be replaced to protect the instructional environment and building infrastructure at Club Boulevard, Forest View, R.N. Harris, Holt, Oak Grove, Parkwood, C.C. Spaulding, George Watts, Lowe's Grove, Durham School of the Arts, Jordan and Central Services.

HVAC system upgrades \$3,093,750

Controls and components will be replaced, making climate control systems more dependable and efficient at Burton, Eastway, Hillandale, Hope Valley, Lakewood Elementary, Little River K-8, Parkwood, E.K. Powe, C.C. Spaulding and Watts.

Lighting upgrades \$1,783,606

Outdated and obsolete lighting fixtures will be replaced with LED fixtures, reducing energy costs and providing brighter, more natural lighting at Bethesda, Club Boulevard, Eastway, Holt, Mangum, Merrick-Moore, Rogers-Herr, Lakeview and Central Services.

Athletics

\$2,375,000

High schools will receive track repair, tennis lights and interior renovations.

Other district-wide projects and bond management \$7,763,700

Based on site-specific needs, schools will receive general renovations, food service upgrades, paving, playground upgrades and site repairs.
