Superintendent's Updates:

Dr. Bert L'Homme shared the following:

Board members, we have had so much to celebrate tonight that I am going to keep my remarks very brief, but I am so very proud of the students, educators and staff we have seen tonight.

Last night was our annual Teacher of the Year banquet, and when Ms. Kirtina Jones reacted to being named the 2018 Durham Public Schools Teacher of the Year, I don't think there was a dry eye in the house. We are so proud of her and the other teachers we recognized last night: our school-based teachers of the year, semifinalists and finalists, our Beginning Teachers of the Year, and our new National Board Certified teachers.

We also celebrated our retirees for the 2016-17 school year last week at Croasdaile Country Club. It was great to congratulate those women and men who chose to end their career with Durham Public Schools. Corporate sponsors made both events possible, so I'd like to thank EmergeOrtho and North Carolina Specialty Hospital for supporting our Teacher of the Year Banquet, and H&R Block for supporting the retirement dinner.

Tonight, we honored our Governor's School nominees. I dearly hope that these will not be the last Governor's School nominees from this or any other North Carolina school district. However, as you know, the state Senate's budget would eliminate the Governor's School in favor of what would appear to be a much more limited program. Governor's School supports academic excellence in art, music, theater, English, math and natural sciences. More of our students need the opportunity to participate. I urge the state House, as they review the Senate budget, to fight for Governor's School.

Finally, board members, I would like to ask that you amend your agenda for the night to hear a report from Dr. Kelvin Bullock. He has been doing some great work as our new executive director for equity affairs, and I would like him to give you an update on equity in our schools and on the community conversations he has begun.

And that, Mr. Chair, completes my report.
