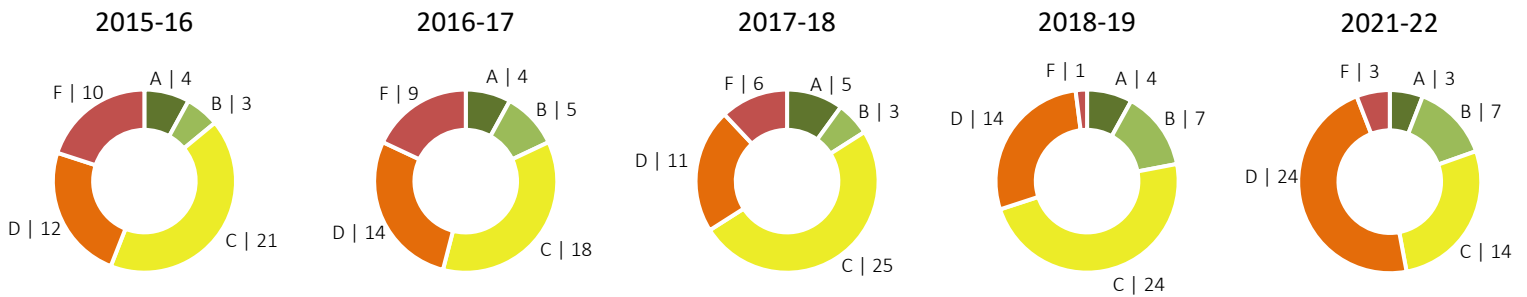

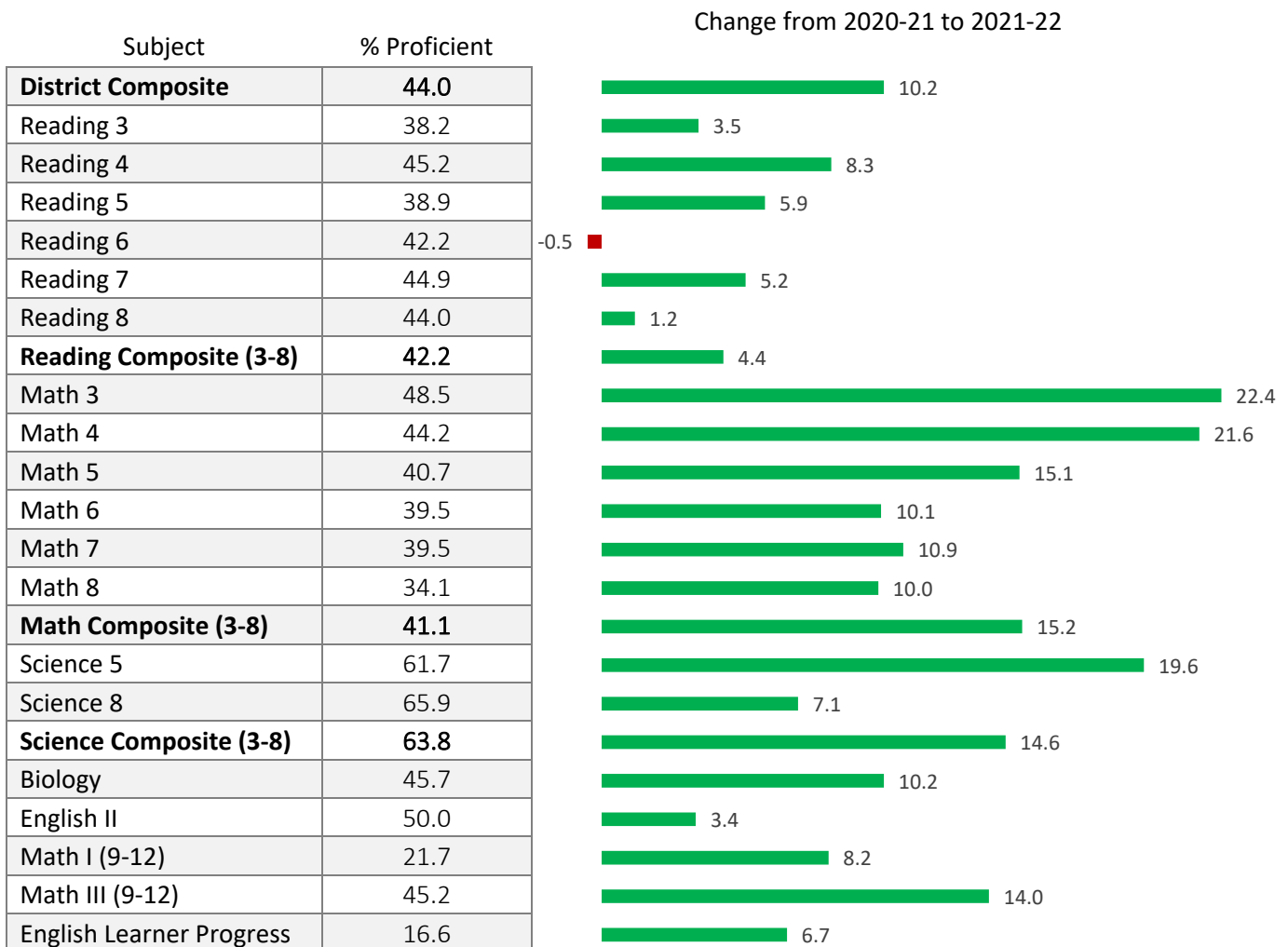
2 SCHOOL PERFORMANCE GRADES

The North Carolina General Assembly requires that individual schools are given overall school scores for achievement, growth, and performance. Each of those indicators is combined (80% achievement, 20% growth) to designate a School Performance Grade for each academic year. The chart below shows the distribution of School Performance Grades over the last five (5) academic years for which data is available. School Performance Grades were not assigned in 2019-20 and 2020-21 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.



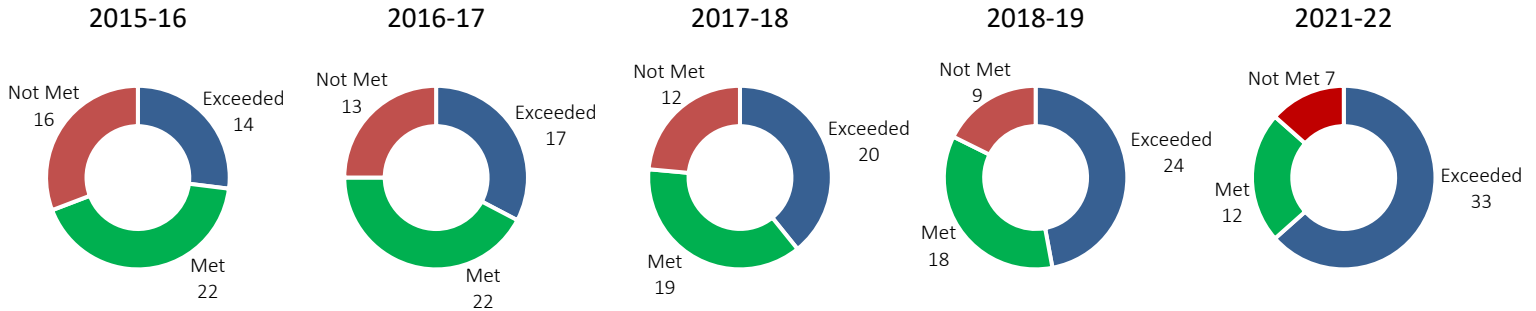
3 COMPOSITE TEST SCORE COMPARISONS

Durham Public Schools gives standardized tests each academic year, as required by the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction. The following table shows grade level proficiency, by each test, for the 2021-22 school year. It also shows the change in proficiency from the 2020-21 school year.



4 OVERALL GROWTH STATUS

Academic growth is an indication of the progress that students in the school made over the previous year. The standard is roughly equivalent to a year’s worth of growth for a year of instruction. Growth is reported for each school as Exceeded Growth Expectations, Met Growth Expectations, or Did Not Meet Growth Expectations, as measured by EVAAS, a statistical tool North Carolina uses to measure student growth. Growth statuses were not assigned in 2019-20 and 2020-21 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.



5 LOW-PERFORMING SCHOOLS

Schools that receive a School Performance Grade of D or F, and a growth status of Met or Not Met, are designated low-performing.

Beginning with 2021-22, the ACT minimum composite score is 19; it was previously 17. This change affects ACT and ACT/WorkKeys measures.
